Adjectives and Degrees of Comparison

An **Adjective** is a word that describes a noun or a pronoun.

For example:

- Ayush is wearing a **red** shirt.

There are different kinds of adjectives.

+ Adjective of Quality

Adjective of quality tells **what kind** of noun or pronoun is. It describes characteristic of a noun or pronoun.

For example:

- 1. It is a **tall** tree.
- 2. It was a **sunny** day.

+ Adjective of Quantity

Adjectives of Quantity tell us **how much** of things. It tells us approximate amount not the exact number of a noun. Adjectives of quantity are followed by singular uncountable nouns.

For example:

- Ayush ate the **whole** cake.
- How **much** money do you need?

+ Adjective of Number

Adjectives of Number tell us **how many** of things. It tells us the exact number of a noun.

For example:

- Arun has **three** cars.
- The **first** boy in the row is wearing red hat.

+ Demonstrative Adjective

Demonstrative Adjectives **point out** a particular noun or pronoun. (**this/that/these/those**)

For example:

- **These** flowers are very beautiful.
- Give me **those** books.

Degrees of Comparison

- **Positive Degree-** Radha's voice is **sweet**.
- **Comparative Degree-** Sneha's voice is **sweeter than** Radha's.
- **Superlative Degree-** Rekha's voice is the **sweetest** of all the girls.

Formation of Comparative and Superlative:

1. Most adjectives form the Comparative by adding 'er' and the Superlative by adding 'est' to the Positive, as:

Bright

brighter

brightest

2. When the positive ends in 'e', only 'r' is added to the Comparative and 'st' to the Superlative:

Brave

braver

bravest

3. When the positive ends in a single consonant preceded by a short vowel, this consonant is doubled before adding 'er' to the Comparative and 'est' to the Superlative.

Big

bigger

biggest

4. When the positive ends in 'y', preceded by a consonant, the 'y' is changed into 'i' before 'er' to the Comparative and 'est' to the Superlative:

Happy

happier

happiest

5. Some Adjectives form the Comparative by using 'more' with the comparative and the Superlative by using 'est' with the Positive.

Difficult

more difficult

most difficult

6. Some Adjectives are compared irregularly i.e., their Comparatives and Superlatives are not formed from the Positives.

Good

better

best
