My dear young Superheroes,





Our tiny tots of grade Vatikā ,explored about the concept of different seasons and time (day and night) under the Transdisciplinary theme – How the world works. Under this theme learners learnt names of various seasons and objects we use in different seasons and why.

Probing questions made them enable to develop their critical thinking skill and application of their learning in real life situations. They learnt about connected activities in daily routine and also understood that we need to change our daily activities according to the time and season.

Tiny tots also explored the world of animals under the theme – Sharing the planet. They were very curious to explore this theme as it was based on animals and their habitats. They enhanced their vocabulary by learning the names of land and water animals. They also dived into the concept of wild, domestic and pet animals by doing different fun activities like making animal masks, creating stories using hand puppets and stick puppets of animals, animal walk activity and making sounds of animals. They enjoyed watching a video of Mysore zoo.

They developed the learner profile attribute, knowledgeable by knowing the things we get from animals and after completing this theme they understood the importance of animals in our lives as well as our responsibilities towards them. They took a pledge to take care of animals in their surroundings.

Our tiny tots of grade Praveshika engaged themselves in learning about the world of plants. They enjoyed a nature walk around the school where they saw different shapes, textures and sizes of leaves.



They enthusiastically participated in the germination activity and enjoyed seeing its growth day by day and recorded the data. They showcased attributes of inquirer and knowledgeable by learning the names of different types and parts of plants. They loved to do different art and craft activities related to the theme.

Little learners understood the importance of community helpers under the theme – How we organise ourselves. They also understood the importance of being organized in their lives. Under this theme they came to know about community helpers, their workplaces and the tools they use. They also developed their critical thinking skill while doing step inside activities a day without community helpers.

During the theme "Where We Are in Place and Time"- Learners became familiar with the concept of different climatic conditions around the world and researched what would be the appropriate design, construction, and materials for the houses in those areas. They also learned that the objective of the house is to keep people comfortable in all weather and seasons, so they are safe and protected from windy, rainy, snowy, and hot weather. They realized that homes are designed in a particular way so that they work best in certain climates and according to the climate, there is a change in the shape of roofs too. They also explored houses in other countries like Bali [Indonesia], and China. They also explored that the structure of houses differs around the world depending upon the climatic conditions. Students brainstorm and discuss the wide range of different types of materials used in various climates. They also observed changes in the structure of houses over time. They become knowledgeable about eco-friendly materials used nowadays in the construction of houses which is in favour of the environment. They enjoyed the learning journey as they developed their research skills as well and they became responsible as they promised that they would keep their house as well as the surroundings clean. 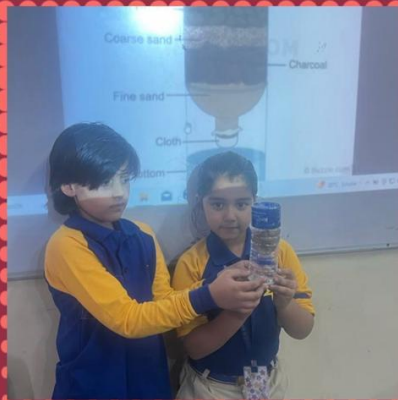

Theme - Sharing the planet has given us the opportunity to research and investigate our flora and fauna under the Central Idea - The characteristics of animals determine their survival and interdependence with other living things. Our inquisitive learners have explored the classification of animals on the basis of their food habits, and the way they move and differentiate on the basis of their habitat. This was an amazing journey for us to find the interconnection of animals in nature through the food chain. They explored endangered and extinct animals and shared information about them. Learners inferred human activities that are harming our flora and fauna at an alarming rate. They got an opportunity to attend a guest lecture by Mr. Rakesh Prajapat a local animal activist who is taking an enormous effort in saving snakes and he imparted information about the importance of snakes in the food chain and how killing them will disturb the balance of our environment and its consequences.

Under this theme, learners enthusiastically expressed themselves through dance, drama, art, music and song. They became risk-takers by showcasing performing skills. They reflected on their learning journey through Ballet dance, Tap dance, Indian Folk dance, Nepalese song, and Drama demonstrating nine essential expressions. They also enjoyed a guest lecture session by Mr. Raju Kumar, a Drama teacher on different ways of expression. They were able to explain how art forms have an impact on an individual.

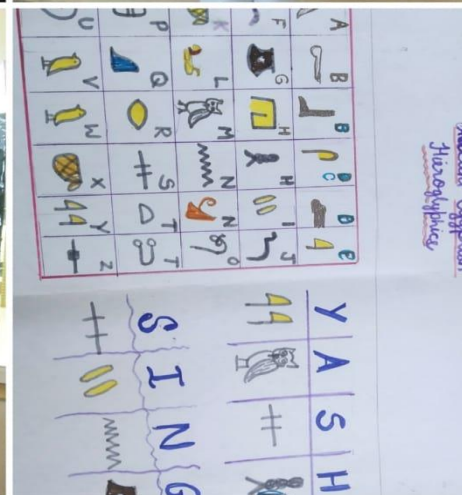
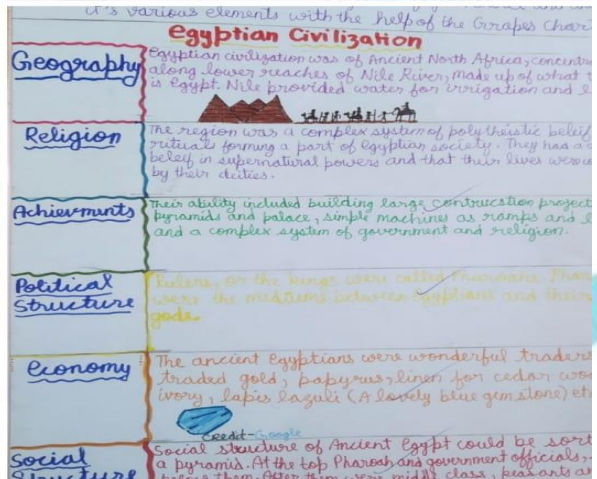
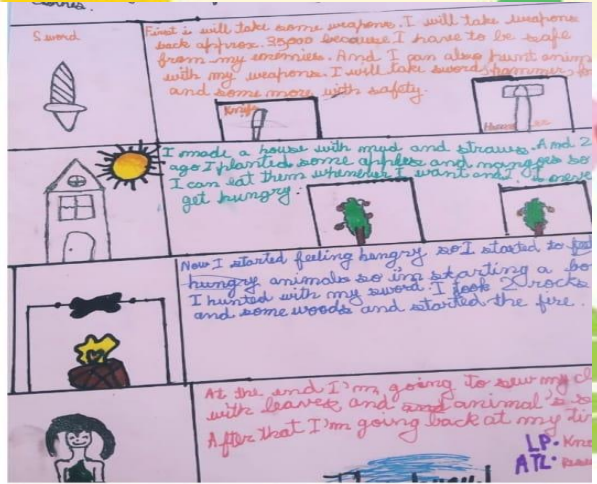

A guest lecture by Mr. Amit helped them to understand why the storage of energy is done and how it works. Visit to the solar panel enhanced their understanding of the Law of Conservation of Energy. Learners suggested small steps to conserve energy and also spread awareness among others to do the same.



How we express ourselves was chosen for the **PYP exhibition** for the year 2023-24. Learners explored how different countries of the world express their beliefs, values and culture, challenges, and opportunities through different art forms. Each section of Grade 5 selected a country and researched in groups as well as individually and framed their own central idea and lines of inquiry. They researched the beliefs, values, culture, traditions, language, literature, food, festivals, trade, politics, currency and performing arts of Brazil, Mexico, France, Indonesia, and Russia. Guest lectures by the native speakers of these countries were organised that help the young minds to get the answers to their questions and they gauged better understanding.

Young inquirers presented their research work through charts, posters, games, PowerPoint presentations, fashion-shows, music and dance performances. Learners became open-minded and started appreciating the culture, beliefs and values of other countries. They were able to compare the features of other countries with their motherland- India. During the entire process, the change in the learners was seen in terms of the development of learner profile attributes and skills. PYP exhibition witnessed the research work of learners on beliefs, values, challenges, opportunities and cultures of different countries through different art forms. It was shared with the parent community.

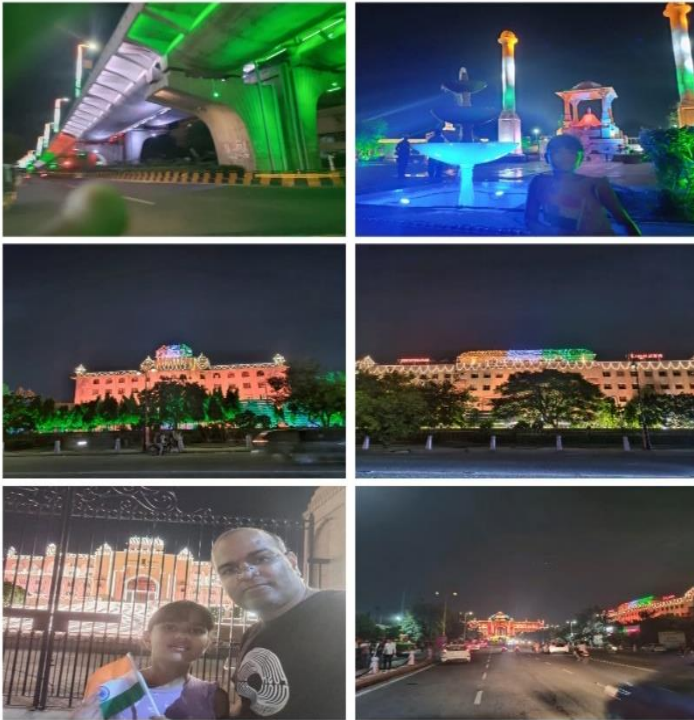
Handloom Day (August 7, 2023)

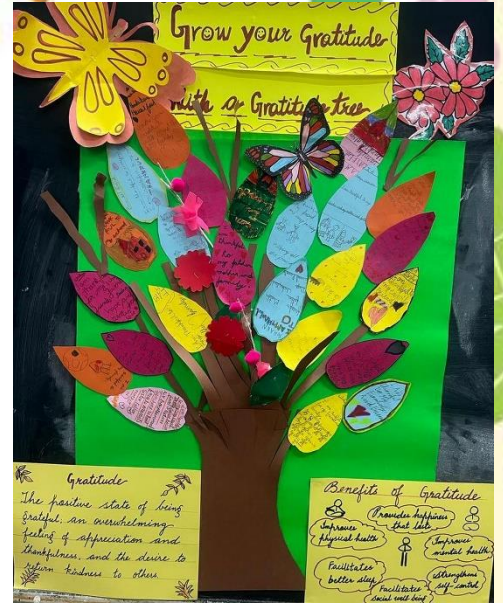
The winners were encouraged with medals, and all the participants were given refreshments to energise themselves. Indeed it was a remarkable and spectacular event.

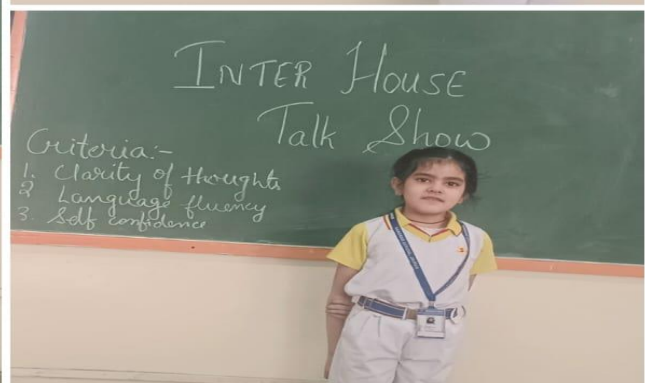
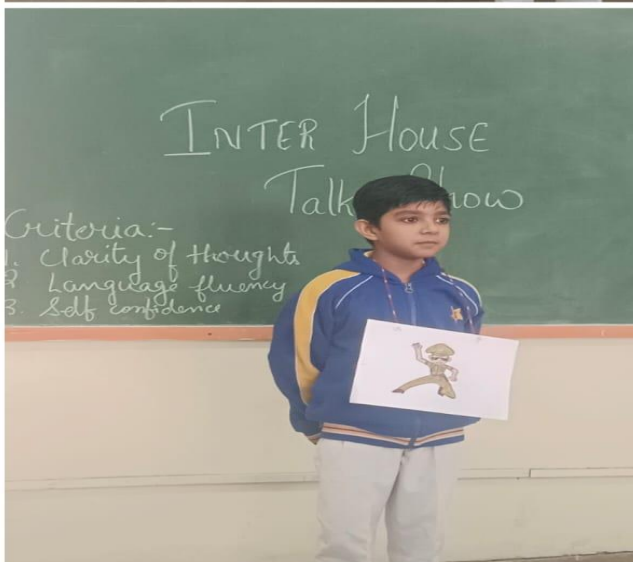
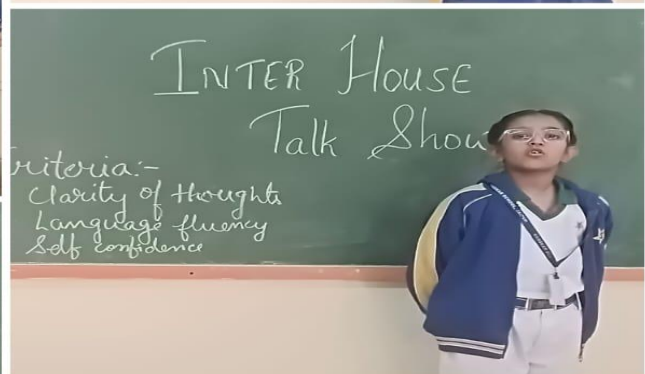
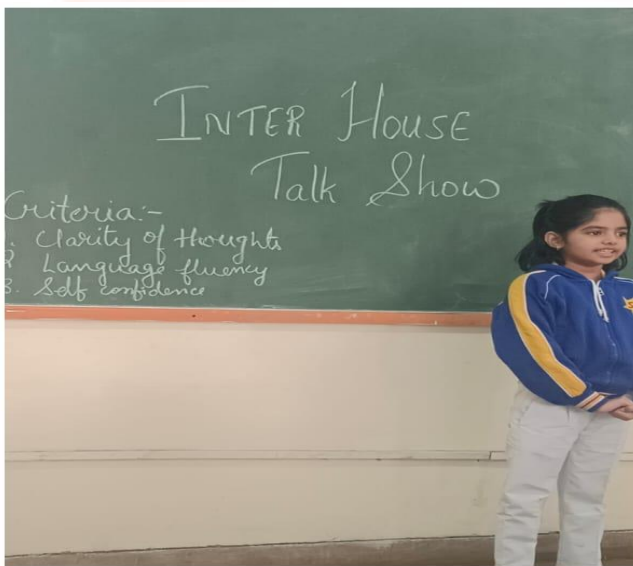


Inter House Talk Show Competition (November 22, 2023)
