




NATIONAL YOUTH DAY 12TH JAN 2022

The event concluded with a vote of thanks and a message of congratulation to the office-bearers.


HUMAN RIGHTS DAY 10TH DEC 2021

To highlight and solve the problem of increasing plastic usage in today's life, IBDP Year1 students took up this as a challenge and came up with a sustainable project by Reuse, Recycle and Reduce plastic with ECO BRICK Project under their CAS.



An Eco brick is essentially a reusable building block created by solid non-biodegradable waste placed into a plastic bottle to a set density. By packing the bottles with a set density, it makes them suitable building blocks for virtually any construction.

Students not only executed the idea but also created awareness about ECO Brick for students of Grade 1st to Grade 11th. Eco Bricks around 6000 were made and using these eco-bricks a sitting arrangement was constructed by students.
