

Personal inquiry

Purpose of promoting individual inquiry

Action: Personal inquiries provide the local and potentially global contexts that can encourage students to take responsible action in a meaningful, mindful and responsive way. Students planning and carrying out personal inquiries may need support in initiating action. Different circumstances such as available resources, different forms of collaboration and interactions might need to be considered. Action can be personal or collective. Here are some examples

- a change in attitude
- a consideration or plan for action in the future
- a demonstration of responsibility, or of respect for self, others and the environment
- a commitment to supporting a local community group or volunteering
- an engagement in family, community, or local decision making

Role of the family

Family members are encouraged to contribute their expertise and feedback where possible. They can support their child to:

- Explore ideas
- Listen and question for clarification and deeper understanding
- Prioritize goals
- Establish timelines
- Browse and suggest suitable resources
- Designate check-in times to see how learning is progressing and discuss next steps
- Share their inquiries with extended families or friends
- Celebrate learning and daily achievements
