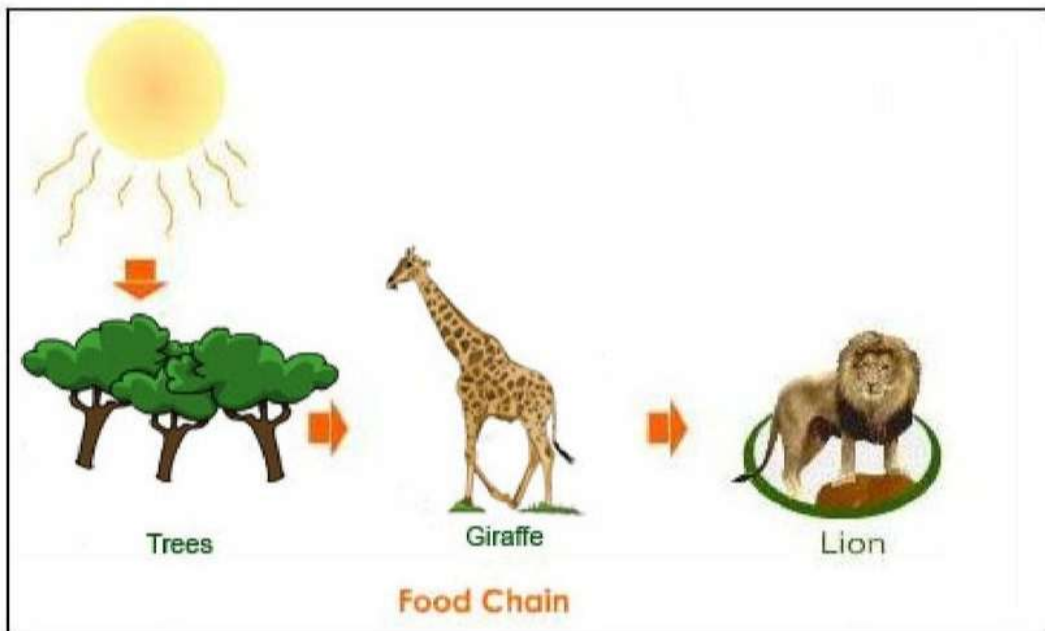

4. What message can you give your friends about man and the environment?



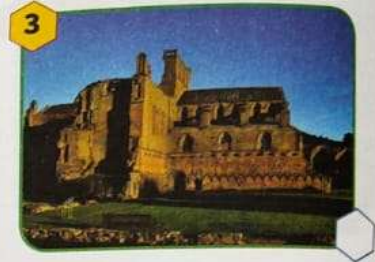

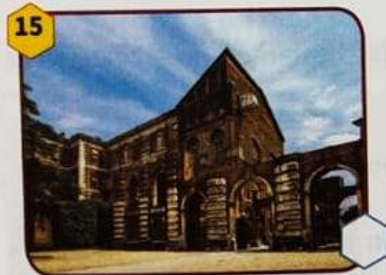
Did You Know?
